LICENSING OF BONDED WAREHOUSES FOR THE YEAR 2023

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 62 of the East African Community Customs Management Act, 2004; and Section 74 and 217 of the East African Community Customs Management Regulations, 2010;

We would like to inform the public that licenses to operate Bonded Warehouses for the year 2023 will be renewed subject to fulfillment of the conditions for the existing licenses;

Interested Bonded Warehouse operators are requested to submit their applications for renewal together with the required documents not later than 4 November 2022 5:00 PM at Customs office DP World, Masaka.

Bonded warehouses wishing to renew their licenses should submit the following requirements:

- 1. A letter to the Commissioner for Customs Services indicating goods to be warehoused;
- 2. A filled form designed for licensing of bonded warehouse (Form C18);
- 3. Certificate of registration of the company;



- 4. Valid tax clearance certificate;
- 5. Proof of EBM version 2 registration;
- 6. Copy of identity card or passport for the warehousekeeper;
- 7. Curriculum vitae for the warehousekeeper;
- 8. Valid employment contract for the warehousekeeper;
- 9. A recent passport size photograph;
- 10. Valid criminal record for the warehousekeeper;
- 11.A rental contract whose duration is equal to or longer than the duration of the license applied for or proof of ownership of the premises.

NOTE:

- 1. Applications together with the required documents shall be submitted not later than 4 November 2022.
- 2. Late and incomplete applications shall lead to disqualification.
- 3. A field visit will be conducted at the premises to verify if required conditions are fulfilled.

NOTE TO NEW APPLICANTS

- No new bonded warehouses shall be admitted to operate in Kigali based on concession agreement signed between the Government of Rwanda with DP World Logistics Ltd on 15 January 2016.
- 2. Those wishing to establish warehouses outside the City of Kigali should first consult with MINICOM before making any investment.
