What is **Immovable** property tax?

Immovable property tax means a tax levied on property that has a fixed location and cannot be moved elsewhere together with its improvements.












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The immovable property tax is assessed and paid by the owner, a representative or any other person considered to be the owner.















Who is considered as the owner of immovable property?

"Owner of immovable property"

means a person registered as owner of an immovable property or a holder of other rights on the property and whoever is considered to be the owner of the property in accordance with Rwandan law.

















When is immovable property tax declared?

It must be declared no later than December 31st every year.















Who is responsible for declaring and paying tax for a co-owned immovable property?

If immovable property is owned by more than one co-owner, the co-owners appoint and authorize one of them or any other person to represent them.















How is the immovable property tax calculated?

The tax on undeveloped land is determined by the District or City Council based on land area, location (urban or rural), its designated use, and available infrastructure. The tax rate should range between RWF 0-80 per square meter.

For developed land, fixed rates are applied based on the market value of the building and its plot.















How is the immovable property tax rate assessed on land with buildings?

- 0.5% of the market value of both the building and related plot of land for residential use
- 0.3% of the market value of both building and related plot of land for commercial use
- 0.1% of the market value of both the building and related plot of land for industrial use, building and plot belonging to micro-enterprises and small businesses.















Do people who acquired immovable properties in 2024 have to pay property tax for this year?

Yes, a person who was given the right to be called the owner of an immovable property and received a land title this year, must pay property tax, if it was not paid by the previous owner.
